Introduction



The Rotary Club of Patong Beach is the brainchild of one of Phuket's foremost businessmen, Paiboon Upatising. As Phuket's first-ever directly elected Senator, Mr Paiboon wanted to establish a forum where people from the foreign business community could meet with Thai government officials to exchange views and improve mutual understanding. As a long-time Rotarian, Senator Paiboon decided that founding a new, English speaking Rotary Club would be the best way of achieving this goal. Being part of Rotary would also allow Phuket's foreign business people, to show their long-term commitment to the island by becoming involved with community service and charity.

As such, on 9 January 2001, the Senator invited a selected group of foreign business people to attend a meeting at the Aloha Villa Hotel. During the meeting it was decided to form the Rotary Club of Patong Beach with the aim of fostering Goodwill and Understanding between Thai officials and the foreign business community.

The new Club has received invaluable assistance from members of the Rotary Club of Phuket, most notably Past President Surasak Chaianupong, who advised on matters of organization and meeting procedures. The members became active in community projects right away and many government officials graced the Club's weekly meetings as Guest Speakers.

On 5 September 2001 the Rotary Club of Patong Beach received official accreditation from Rotary International.

Toothpaste, some food and visits to hospitalized foreigner who had been injured by the Tsunami had been organised and then the need for foreigner sized caskets had been brought to our attention. Rtn. Brad Kenny gave the property before his offices at bypass road and ANT Construction did supply the workers (a big Thank You to Andi Marsh who donated his and his staff's time to this project). Over 100 caskets had been produced and send to Phang Nga province where they where needed the most.





We had an active year of service and work in the community with many successful projects under the leadership of Services Chairman Brad Kenny. The first project was a joint project with the US Navy for one of their Community Relations efforts and these joint projects continued through the year as other ships arrived.

We conducted a Matching Grant for the purchase of hospital equipment for the Takua Thung hospital in Phang Nga. This grant was implemented and managed by Able Wanamakok.





We continued our clubs support for the Life Home Project on Koh Siree and their mission to help HIV infected mothers and children We launched a matching grant with the Rotary Club of Vasteras in Sweden to provide kitchen equipment and many different necessities for this wonderful organisation

We participated actively in immunising children against polio in our community in two national immunisation days one in December and one in January. This great hands on project really shows the power of Rotary in working to eliminate a global scourge of polio.







We held two kids days for children from the Phuket Special schools over the year and both were wonderful events for all.

These are days designed to bring some fun and entertainment into the lives of some very special children. We have games and fun for them and bring a magician to provide a show. We also organise a great lunch for the children and their teachers. Every child that participates received a special medal of recognition at the end of the day

This was also a year of wrapping up several of our legacy tsunami projects and confirming that completed projects were still functioning.

The largest project of the club remained the Scholarship project which continued under Larry's able administration with 177 children as part of the program.

The public relations committee under Chairman Best Wanamakok successfully applied for a Rotary PR Grant and was able to use those funds to secure a billboard on the Patong Hill with a public service message about Rotary's efforts thereby helping to raise awareness of Rotary in our

community.

Three Patong Beach members became Paul Harris Fellows during the year, Larry Amsden, Brad Kenny and me.



The year 2009-2010 saw an enormous upswing in the number of Community Services projects, together with some important improvements in the way the Club is run.

We held our Installation Night in conjunction with the other Rotary Clubs in Phuket.







In July, we saw the completion of Phase I of the Home & Life revetment project, with more than B 200,000 spent on engineering and installation of the revetment walls. It was a very successful project that helped maintain the grounds of Home & Life.

Stuart Bird left Phuket and headed back to England. Norman Dawkins replaced him as VP. Norman's experience and wisdom helped guide us through many discussions, and his enthusiasm moved mountains.

The Home & Life project gained a life of its own, as H&L successfully transitioned to an official, government recognized charitable organization.

The District Governor's visit went extremely well. DG Thienchai offered RCoPB as a model for other Rotary clubs in the district, based on our well-regarded work in and around Phuket. The DG urged us to attract more members.

Brad Kenny received (another) Paul Harris Fellowship, for his continuing stellar performance as our Community Services Chairman.

We started a gradual transformation from the Matching Grant system to the new method employed by Rotary International, the Rotary Future Vision Plan. It's a significant change, mandated by the recession-related shortfall in RI capital, and by changing needs throughout the world. Our District is one of the first pilot districts worldwide. We received our final Matching Grant under the old system, number 71771, for projects at Home & Life and at a public school in Phang Nga.

The Beach Fun Fest was a roaring success, with proceeds being equally divided between the Home & Life project, and our club's newly established non-tsunami Scholarship Fund.



















The annual Christmas party proved fabulous as always, with Rtn Wolfgang and the Holiday Innstaff offering a wonderful venue and tantalizing food.













Secretary Ingo Mueller announced that his firm was moving him to Bali. (Nothing like a hardship posting!) PP Sam offered to fill in for the remainder of the year.

Many members have noted that our meeting room is filling up frequently. We discussed – but did not act upon – ideas for expanding the room that we have, or at least re-arranging things to get the maximum seating room. And we bought a new projector for the room.

We struggled with the timing and location of Board meetings. Electronic "meetings" with a bulletin board didn't work. Monthly meetings weren't frequent enough to deal with pressing questions. So we moved to bi-weekly meetings.

In addition to dozens of Comrel projects, led by Rtn Brad in unison with the US Navy,









Our club also held a Kids Day Out (Rtn Richard), and started working with the Athletic Squad in Surrakul Stadium (Rtn Michael), to improve the living conditions and generally support the effort there with troubled teens. Rtn Larry continued his work with the tsunami-related Scholarship Fund. He also started working with Moken families, living primarily on Koh Lao and other islands in and around Southern Thailand, who are in dire need of help. He started a working relationship with Father Joe Meier of the Human Development Foundation in Bangkok. Rtns Denis and Pat, working with the RC of Mae Chan, initiated a project to provide scholarships to Hill Tribe students in northern Thailand. Our Club then provided a B 20,000 scholarship to Hill Tribe student K. Arwoo, and an additional B 20,000 to be used by RC Mae Chan for scholarships. Rtn Brad also started a project to supply water to a Hill Tribe in northern Thailand.

All in all, it was an extremely successful year, with almost one project per week, affecting hundreds (if not thousands) of disadvantaged people in Thailand.

Our year has seen a number of disasters, and while these were certainly not welcomed by our club, it has been inspiring to be in a position to help so many other people. Much of our assistance has been of the cash kind, as that is what the circumstances required.

Notably we were quick to support the Japanese victims of the earth quake and tsunami that caused so much death and destruction. Our club made an immediate donation at a district level to go direct to the Rotary district in Japan that was most affected. At present there is a representative of Rotary in Thailand in Japan, and we look forward to seeing the report on how our assistance supported the Japanese people in their hour of need.



Closer to home there have been two disasters that we were able to help with, a slum fire in Patong and a flooding and landslide situation in Krabi.

A fire in Patong left a number of low income earners homeless, and without any possessions. Many of those affected were of Burmese origin and so did not qualify for any government assistance. Our club promptly allocated a large amount of money to support these people and we were able to supply bedding, kitchen utensils and other items

which allowed these people to get back on with their lives.

The flooding in Krabi and subsequent landslides killed a number of people and left even more homeless. Our club donated immediately from our cash reserves and also participated in a very successful street collection in Patong, along with other Phuket Rotary Clubs.

In other areas, we were able to work in a more community development kind of way, rather than a disaster response situation.

Through the efforts of our travelling Rotarians Rick and Anne, we have been able to amass a I arge amount of English language books from the USA, that have been donated to the Phuket Library. These will be of use to both English speaking expats and Thai people wanting to improve their English language skills. It is anticipated that this project will co ntinue into future years.

We had a very successful Kid's Day at the Phuket Special School in Pakhlok. These often over looked c hildren got to watch a lot of expat and Thai adults play a range of sports, join in a bunch of fun games and watch a magic show. The adults enjoyed themselves and the lunch. It is assumed the kids had a good time too.

The club, in conjunction with the US Navy League worked on a number of Comrels throughout Phuket and beyond. These Comrels (Community Relations activities) are opportunities for visiting US navy service people to work on local community programs. Our club members organized, liaised, financially supported and participated in many projects with both navy personnel, other local people and the Phuket US Navy League.





Our main fundraising event of the year was a golf day and charity auction. Held at Laguna, the event was a great success, and contributed significantly to the financial well being of the club.







Other activities and milestones in the year are:

- Continued support of the Home and Life Foundation in Phang Nga (orphanage and disadvantaged kids);
- As required support for the Life Home Project at Koh Sirey (women and children with AIDS);
- Continued support of over 200 children on the Tsunami Scholarship Program, which now includes both tsunami affected and other disadvantaged children.
- Support for the mother and children of a Thai lady who was murdered in Phuket. These two children concerned are now on the above scholarship program.
- We now have a Hill Tribe student being supported through university, where he hopes to acquire a degree in engineering that will help him provide development assistance to his village.
- We have begun work on a water filter project, in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Saint Moritz, and hope to be able to assist a number of remote and disadvantaged communities obtain clean drinking water.
- Assistance continues to be provided to a sea gypsy village (Moken people), where our club is assisting with water and other facilities.

There are more projects, no doubt some are over looked here. My apologies for the oversight, there is so much that our club does in one year, that it is hard to keep track of all of it.

With the exception of Rick and Anne, who stand out in their efforts on our behalf in the USA, I have refrained from mentioning Rotarians by name. We are a team, and what each of us does is a part of the whole. I thank the team, particularly the board members who have helped me so ably, for all that we achieved in a very successful year.

Other notable projects during the year includes

K-12 Scholarship for Tsunami and Non-Tsunami underprivileged kids

Funding is required for this ongoing project which assists 285 children in primary and secondary school to complete their education. New Scholarship Chair George went up to Phang Nga to learn the ropes from Larry how to distribute the funds.

PCs4Kids – Give away refurbished computers to students and pair them up with mentors. Computers are given to students with computing skills enabling them to develop their education and proceed to an IT vocation. We handed over many completed units.



Activities in conjunction with the Mercy Centre and the Rotary Club of Ranong to improve the lives of Moken families on the island of Koh Lao by providing a clinic, and clean water; participating in distributing water filters with the Rotary Club of St. Moritz in Switzerland, to families along the Andaman coast who did not have potable water; arranging for an operation for a little Moken girl from Koh Lao to correct an eye problem, including a trip to Phuket for the initial consultation; participating in providing polio inoculations to young children living on Koh Sirey in Phuket; providing food for Rohingya refugees in Phang Nga; and distributing over one-million Baht to needy students on our scholarship program.

Perhaps one of the highlights of our community service projects was receiving the news that one of our previous scholarship students, a young Moken girl from the island of Koh Pratong, who had later graduated from a university, had returned to her home on the island to teach school and inspire other Moken children to complete their educations and go to college. To the best of our knowledge, she is the first Moken to graduate from college. We are convinced that the road to a better life for the Mokens along the Andaman coast is through educating their children and we strive to support this objective. Another highlight was receiving Paul Harris Fellowship Awards for nine of our club members in recognition of our club's participation in various joint projects with the Rotary Club of St. Moritz.



Of course, we also participated in Rotary programs including RYLA, we sent six kids, hosting a youth exchange student for a few days while in Phuket, and one of our members leading a VVT/GSE team to Austria.

We had the honour of inducting three new members into the club and welcoming one transferring Rotarian, increasing our membership by about ten percent.

Our weekly meetings, other than the monthly dinners out, consisted of many guest speakers including John Slosar, CEO of Cathay Pacific Airlines, Colin Mackay, author of "A History o Phuket and Surrounding Region", along with a long list of distinguished community leaders.

In order to improve the functioning of our club, we amended our club by-laws, and tried the idea of hiring an administrative assistant (it didn't work out).

During our annual visit by our District Governor, DG Somphop Thirasan, we were complimented on our many successful projects and later, at our District Assembly in Phuket, received the RI District award for Peace and the District Outstanding Project award for our Youthlinc project, and the Presidential Citation for our contributions to the District goals.









Bargteheide/Germany & RC of Shouson Hill/Hong Kong) confirmed their participation we decided to turn that project into a Global Grant with the District 3330 support of granting USD 5,000 (155,000 THB) as DDF. A few days ago, RI approved the Global Grant and the total amount we are spending is 1,845,809.00 THB or USD 57,682.00.

The Patong Hospital is a public hospital constantly underfunded. With the help of our Rotary Club we can help the community of Patong have better treatment at the important and only hospital on Phuket's West Coast. This Global Grant Project will pay, among others, for automatic infusion pumps, bedside monitoring systems, haematocrit centrifuges, manual resuscitator, etc.







One additional feature working with some of our international contacts actually led to the signing of a **SISTER Club Agreement** with the RC Shouson Hill of Hong Kong.

We held a signing ceremony at the SKYE Lake Club with many happy fellow Members & guests from Hong Kong in attendance.

Tsunami Scholarships 2019/2020

Save a Child Swim Program - One School

Safe Swim & Water Safety Project 2019/2020

The program was launched in June 2018 with the objective of teaching all the children in the 5th grade from Sai Nam Yen School, 96 children in total, to swim and fundamentals of water safety to prevent droning. The course lasted for three weeks with the children being taught one hour each week. The instructors, 6 instructors for each class of 32 children, were recruited from PADI certified dive masters and dive instructors. The program concluded in August and most of the children passing the final examination. The children subsequently received a certificate testifying to their completion of the course.













The participating students also helped the local community by doing a beach clean-up of Patong Beach.











Give Bowls to Shrine in Phuket

Joint Project with all 9 Rotary Clubs in Phuket - 300 pieces of melamine tableware donated to Chinese Shrine during Vegetarian Festival in Phuket.

During September all Chinese Shrines offer free vegetarian foods for visitors. The 9 Rotary Clubs in Phuket joined hands to donate more than 300 sets of new tableware to the Aam Jong Ngi Kang shrine to serve people during the festival. (Located at the entrance of Ton Sai Waterfall), Thalang District, Phuket as hygiene and cleanliness are our concern.



Save a Child Swim Program & Promotional Video Safe Swim & Water Safety Project 2020/2021













The program was launched in June 2018 started with one school in Patong and expanded in 2021/22 to 3 additional schools. The program cost is financed 100% by Rotary which welcomes any donation from private sources towards the continuation of this program. To date, the Rotary swim program has issued 350 certificates of completion. An additional important part of the program teaches the children how to safely assist a drowning person. The Rotary Club of Patong Beach was supported in the project by The Four Point Sheraton Hotel, Patong Beach, JD Pools and Helicam.asia.















During this current course Helicam.asia produced a promotional video on location and it was presented by President Elect Dieter Dratwa & Dr. Johan Storck Chairman of Community Service Projects.

Vehicle replacement for Handicapped K. Jarin

After Tsunami on Phuket K. Jarin had received support for a new vehicle to drive to work and much needed surgery by the Rotary Club of Nepean in 2014. After the first closing of Phuket because of Covid-19 in 2020 Rtn. Barbara Mitchel again contacted us as K. Jarin meanwhile had lost his second leg from medical complication and needed a newly adjusted vehicle (motorbike) to be able to go to work in Patong (having a small stall in front of hotel by the beach). Our club helped to support with 12,000 THB on needed adjustment for his special needs which was finalized this April 2021

Painting at Life Home Project Foundation

Life Home Project Foundation on Phuket is a Foundation giving home and shelter to Aids infected or effected children of any age up to 18 years of age and support higher education for some of our long-term residents (after leaving LHP). This year rooms for children need a good restoration and the RC of Patong Beach agreed to start with the rooms for the youngest boys and purchased paint and material and by Hands On project with some volunteers did repaint and donate material for repairs. It was a hot day and to bring a smile to the children's faces I purchased ice-creams for them all.















Covid-19 Support for Vaccination Volunteers

To achieve a quick opening of Phuket for Tourists a drive was implemented to vaccinate at least 70 % of Phuket citizens against Covid-19 whereas the vaccine is provided by the Government and volunteers helping to organize and implement. These Volunteers are at the different vaccination areas without food and water all day, thus Rotary Clubs on Phuket agreed to sponsor the food and water for volunteers and the Rotary Club of Patong Beach taking care of food and water for 10 days vaccination.


































PAUL HARRIS FELLOW AWARDS 2019/2020
